1. The judging contest is open to individuals enrolled in 4-H and FFA, however, no college enrollees are allowed to participate, although they are welcome to audit the clinic.
2. Juniors are in 8th grade and below. Seniors are in 9th grade and above. A team may have both juniors and seniors on their team.
3. No entry fee or pre-entry needed – sign up at the door.
4. Four people per team. Pick up team packets at the registration desk. If you aren't part of an official team and would like to be, find other friends or attendees and ask them to be on your team, then pick up a team packet from the registration desk. All team members are automatically entered in the individual competition.
5. No low scores will be thrown out; all scores on a team will be used.
6. You can also choose to just participate as an individual in the individual competition.
7. No oral reasons; class placings only. The judge will give informal oral reasons and assign cut values to each pair in the class. Take notes on these reasons for practice developing your own oral reasons.
8. Hormel scoring table will be used with assigned cut values.
9. Six classes will be judged:
 - a. Halter
 - b. Showmanship
 - c. Western Pleasure
 - d. Horsemanship
 - e. Hunter Under Saddle
 - f. Hunt Seat Equitation
10. You must score all six classes to be eligible for the Individual High Point Award. Teams must score all six classes to be eligible for the Team High Point Award.
